We ordered take out once a month as a little way to treat ourselves and have something to look forward to. We had a fun summer vacation time with a fantastic movie night, a dress up awards evening, theme days, scavenger hunt, more take out because you can never go wrong with food, trips to Emilie's pool and much more.

This past year has been difficult for everyone. For our core members and their families, for the assistants, for our Leadership Team, all of us. It seemed like the rules were changing so often and we were all trying to understand and communicate those changes to everyone as best we could. There were long stretches where core members couldn't see their families and to say that was hard would be a huge understatement. Many assistants who have families in other countries are still unsure of when they will be able to go back home for a visit. And yet, most if not each day, you would still hear laughter in our homes.

My heart is filled with gratitude for every one of you. To the families, for your patience, your trust, and your kindness -Thank You! To the core members, your world has been turned upside down and yet it's you who keeps us all going. When I'm having a rough day, I leave the office and go spend some time with you because you always have a way of making me feel better. To the assistants, what an awesome group of people you are! I learn so much from you and it's a privilege being able to watch you learn and grow.

A special thank you to our Board of Directors for all your support from behind the scenes. Your care and concern for the members of our community is recognized and appreciated.

I'll finish with what has been the highlight for our community-Anna moving into her own apartment through the ILS Program!! This was a huge step for Anna and her family. She has worked so hard for this opportunity. Anna has assistants who spend time with her at her place and help her with things like groceries, meal planning and medical appointments. Anna has supper in each of the homes once a week and will join for any activities or events that she would like to. Anna says that the best part about living on her own is having her own space, having her own food, and not needing to worry about other people taking it. Anna says that sometimes she misses living at Journey House, but she is happier in her own place.

Anna's move has also allowed L'Arche Halifax to be able to grow which we didn't think we would be able to do for a long time so thank you, Anna!!! We now offer the ILS Program which is a DCS funded program that enables people to live in the community with supports from an organization so in Anna's case, it's L'Arche Halifax. We hope this program will be a way for others to join us and find their place of belonging. Anna's moving out created a place for someone else to move in and we were so happy to be able to welcome Ian to Journey House. We are still getting to know Ian and have really appreciated the support and guidance of his family during this time of transition. Ian has lots in common with his house mates and seems to be enjoying living on a busy street in the city. Ian, we are really glad that you have come to live at L'Arche!

In closing, as life slowly returns to what some are calling our new normal, I will share some wise words from my friend, Anna. I have found myself repeating this phrase many times over the past year and it seems to be appropriate to most situations: Step 1-Stay Calm \odot

GROWTH PROJECT

The L'Arche Halifax vision of a dedicated gathering place complimented by a modest component of affordable/accessible apartments is taking shape.

L'Arche Halifax has entered into a formal relationship with the Tamarack Institute (tamarackcommunity.ca) Their role in our project is to "develop and support collaborative strategies that engage citizens and institutions to solve major community issues across Canada and beyond" by providing specialized training and executive coaching in community engagement. We will be working with them over the next year to help identify community needs and connect with potential stakeholders.

Concurrently with that a formal growth committee has been established and a project plan

and capital campaign are being developed. This is a long road that will not bear fruit for several years. That said, progress is happening and we are encouraged by the positive feedback and support we are receiving.
